Welcome

A very warm welcome to Strathearn's very first Drive-In Cinema. Strathearn Arts and Comrie Croft are delighted to be able to present you with a programme of classic films and we're very excited to be able to bring people together again to enjoy watching films on the big screen.

What time do I arrive ?

It is important we manage the flow of traffic so please arrive at the parking slot time stated on your ticket. You will find the parking slot time on the PDF of your Eventbrite ticket so please check before you arrive.

What will happen on arrival ?

On arrival, you will be directed to an allocated parking spot by one of our volunteer stewards. Our car spaces are 3 metres wide to ensure plenty of space between cars. Once parked, a steward will come to your car to do a contactless ticket check so please have your ticket ready, either printed or on your mobile device. If you have a Strathearn Community Ticket you will also need proof of your address, again, either printed or on your mobile device.

How will I hear the film/music?

The sound of the film at our Drive-in Cinema can be heard through your car FM radio system. Frequencies and instructions will be provided on arrival. If you are in any doubt about your car radio, please bring a handheld FM radio to ensure that you can tune in.

Will toilet facilities be available?

Toilet facilities are available on site and clearly signposted. We will operate a queuing system respecting the 2-metre rule. Toilets are checked and disinfected regularly, so we appreciate your patience during this time.

Will we be able to purchase refreshments?

Bonnie Mountain will be our event caterers with a selection of cinema-style food. Social distancing rules will also apply when queuing for your food and drink. We kindly ask that guests be mindful with any rubbish from eating and drinking and to take any rubbish home with you. As this is a Drive-In no alcohol will be sold at the event. Can I pay for food and drink with a Debit / Credit card?

Yes, payment by card is preferable, to limit customer and staff contact. It is, however, still possible to pay with cash.

Are there people on site to help me?

There will be a dedicated events team on site to assist with all your needs. Please do NOT honk your car horn or flash your lights for attention. If you need to speak to a member of the team, please flash your hazard lights, and a member of our team will come to your assistance.


Is there wheelchair access?

Comrie Croft have accessible facilities, however, if it is difficult to operate your chair around the grounds, we would be happy to provide extra assistance, including if you wish to request a parking space closer to the facilities. If you wish to do this, please contact the Strathearn Arts team in advance so the arrival team can then be aware and ready to help.

What if the weather is not on our side?

The event can continue in most types of weather we normally experience in a Scottish Summer but there are times when we may need to cancel. For example: strong winds in excess of 24mph, foggy weather etc. We will assess the weather each day and cancel a screening if we need to. So long as you provided correct email and mobile phone details when you booked, you will receive a message to say the show is cancelled. The showtime will also display as 'cancelled' on the website.
